Hygiene products are something that many of us take for granted, but they are a basic need that everyone should have access to.

Unfortunately, underserved communities, such as low-income families, homeless individuals, and those living in rural areas, often lack access to basic hygiene products. This can have serious consequences for their health and overall wellbeing.

PNANJ Somerset is an advocate for underserved communities and values social determinants of health. They recognize the importance of providing hygiene products to those who need them the most. Basic hygiene products, such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste, and feminine hygiene products, play an essential role in maintaining good health and personal hygiene. Without access to these products, individuals are at risk of developing infections and diseases, which can have long-term health consequences.

Additionally, the lack of access to personal hygiene products can impact a person's mental health and self-esteem, which can lead to social isolation and a decreased quality of life. Lastly, hygienic products provide a bridge for people who are trying to look for employment.

The importance of providing hygienic products to underserved communities is why PNANJ Somerset found 12 drop-off locations and partnered with five (5) charities that support vulnerable populations such as the homeless, abused, orphaned, and anyone dealing with special circumstances especially the youth, women, and seniors.

WHAT WAS PNANJ SOMERSET'S PROCESS & TIMELINE OF EXECUTION

PNANJ Somerset took a proactive approach to address this issue by organizing a hygienic product drive. Here are the steps of how we executed this drive.

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PNANJ SOMERSET'S HYGIENIC PRODUCT DRIVE (CONT.)





Thank you to the Tabora Family for storing about 20 medium-sized boxes of hygienic products. We then sorted and packaged the collected products among five different charities: Casa Shaw, United Way at Hunterdon, Visions and Pathways, The Alternatives, Inc., and Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity. It was a fun team-building activity as well!



HOW MUCH DID WE COLLECT?



Overall, we collected 111 regular size soaps, 164 small soaps, 25 bottles of Full size shampoo, 21 bottles of full size conditioner, 113 small shower gels, 30 bottles of lotions, 17 Baby Powders, 26 bottles of hand sanitizer, 16 toothpastes, 61 toothbrushes, 29 dental floss, 22 deodorants, 5 regular size mouthwash, 38 Razor Blades, 480 Feminine wipes, 372 Sanitary Napkins, 764 individually wrapped wipes, 34 Hair Gels, 4 Shaving Creams, 3 Body Sprays and 78 assorted miscellaneous items. In addition, the Past Presidents donated money to buy elven Big and Small Towels and 11 Laundry Baskets.

UNITED WAY AT HUNTERDON



On April 8th, at the Ukrainian Cultural Center in Somerset, NJ, I had the opportunity to volunteer and serve over 40 uninsured people, most of whom were seniors. Working side by side with internal medicine, cardiologists, dieticians, and opthalmologists, I conducted blood pressure screenings and provided education on blood pressure control. This event also provided EKG and blood draws to help diagnose any underlying health conditions.
